## Call for papers

We invite abstracts for presentations at the ALANZ Writing SIG 1<sup>st</sup> symposium. The conference will be held in person at Te Herenga Waka – Victoria University of Wellington on August 30<sup>th</sup> 2024. Parallel sessions will be 30 minutes in length. Presenters are encouraged to keep their presentations to 20 minutes, to allow plenty of time for discussion.

We welcome abstracts that focus on the analysis of written text, writing practices or processes, or teaching or learning of writing in English, Māori or any Pacific language, as a first language, heritage language or additional language. Presentations can can focus on secondary or empirical research that advances theory or practice of writing, of teaching and/or learning of writing, or analysis of written text.

Please submit an informative title, an abstract (maximum 350 words) and a short blurb to be included in the conference programme (maximum two sentences). Please include all three items in a single MS word document, as well as the names and affiliations of all presenters. ## Abstract Review Criteria

The reviewers will consider the degree to which each abstract:

- Is relevant to the interests of the ALANZ Writing SIG;
- Is situated within literature on the topic;
- Clearly states the focus of the presentation;
- Clearly outlines the research.
